



## **Uniform Expectations**

Taken from OHS School Handbook:

*“The Education Committee recommended at its meeting of 21 August 1997 that - ‘the adoption of a distinctive dress code chosen to enhance the ethos of the school should be encouraged in all schools’. Given that there is substantial parental and public approval of uniform, schools in Argyll and Bute are free to encourage the wearing of school uniform.”*

In Oban High School, the uniform is as follows:

- Standard plain white shirt and school tie (no plunging/low necklines)
- A plain black v-neck jumper or cardigan is optional
- Black trousers
- Black skirt (see below guidelines)
- Plain black shoes
- Hoodies are considered outdoor clothing and must be removed in class

The following should not be worn to school;

- No coloured shoes
- No coloured trainers
- No coloured jeans
- No leggings
- No sports leggings

(Skirts and tailored shorts can be worn but must be no shorter than ‘mid-thigh.’ A reasonable guideline would be that the shorts or skirt should be no shorter than the fingertips when your arm is fully extended down by your side).

## **Physical Education**

Pupils who have Physical Education in the morning should NOT report to school in their PE Kit- they should be in School Uniform and change when they have their PE lesson. BGE pupils must wear their clan T-shirt.

Over lunchtime all pupils should be in their School Uniform and not remain in PE kit.

*The school Clothing Grant for the School Session 2020-21 is £100*

Grants are available for any child who will attend an Argyll & Bute Council from

AUGUST 2020 and whose parent(s) receive:

- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income related element of employment and Support allowance
- Council Tax or Housing Benefit
- Child Tax Credit and Working Tax Credit (Income should not exceed £7,330)
- Universal Credit (monthly take home pay for period must be under £610)
